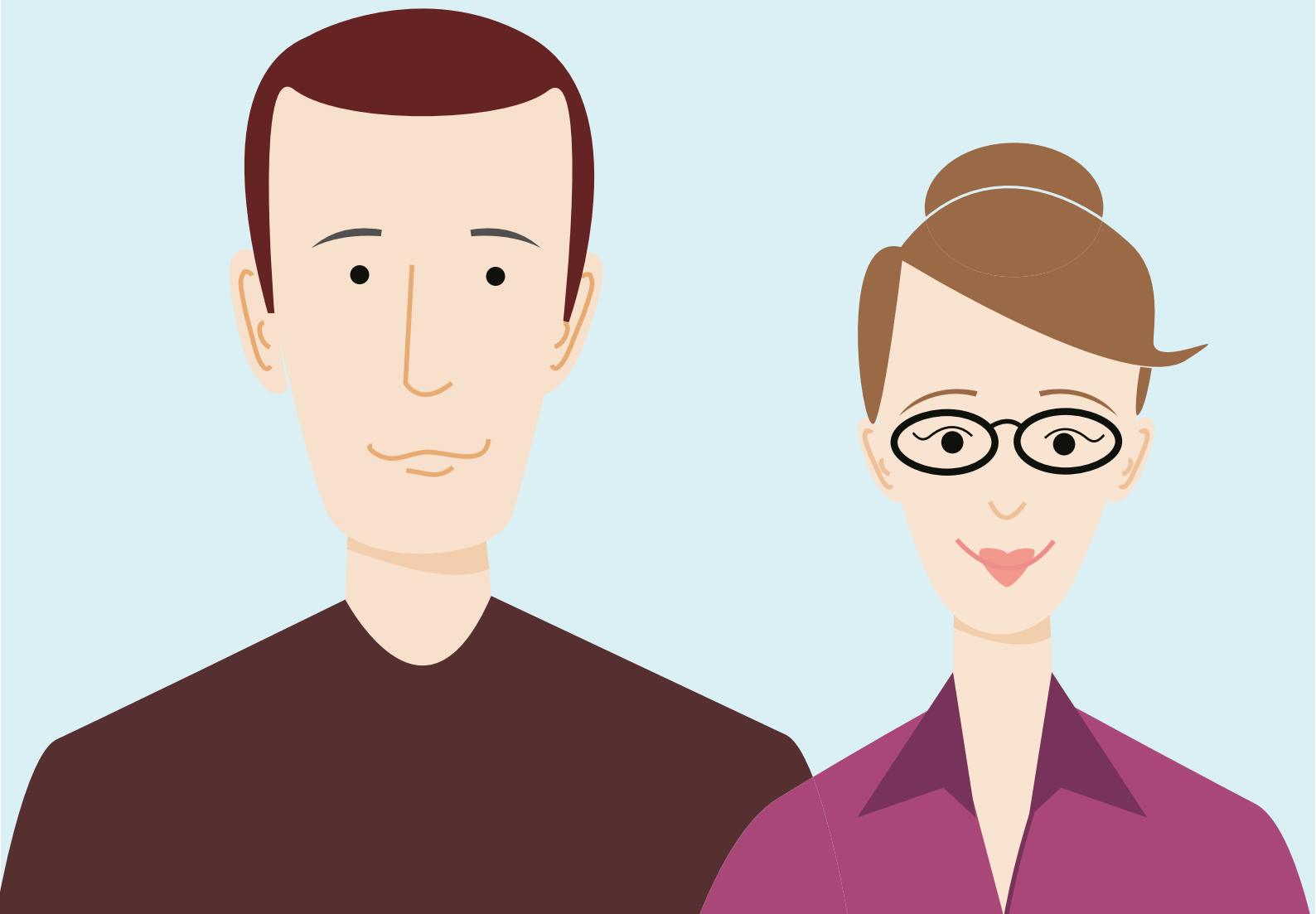

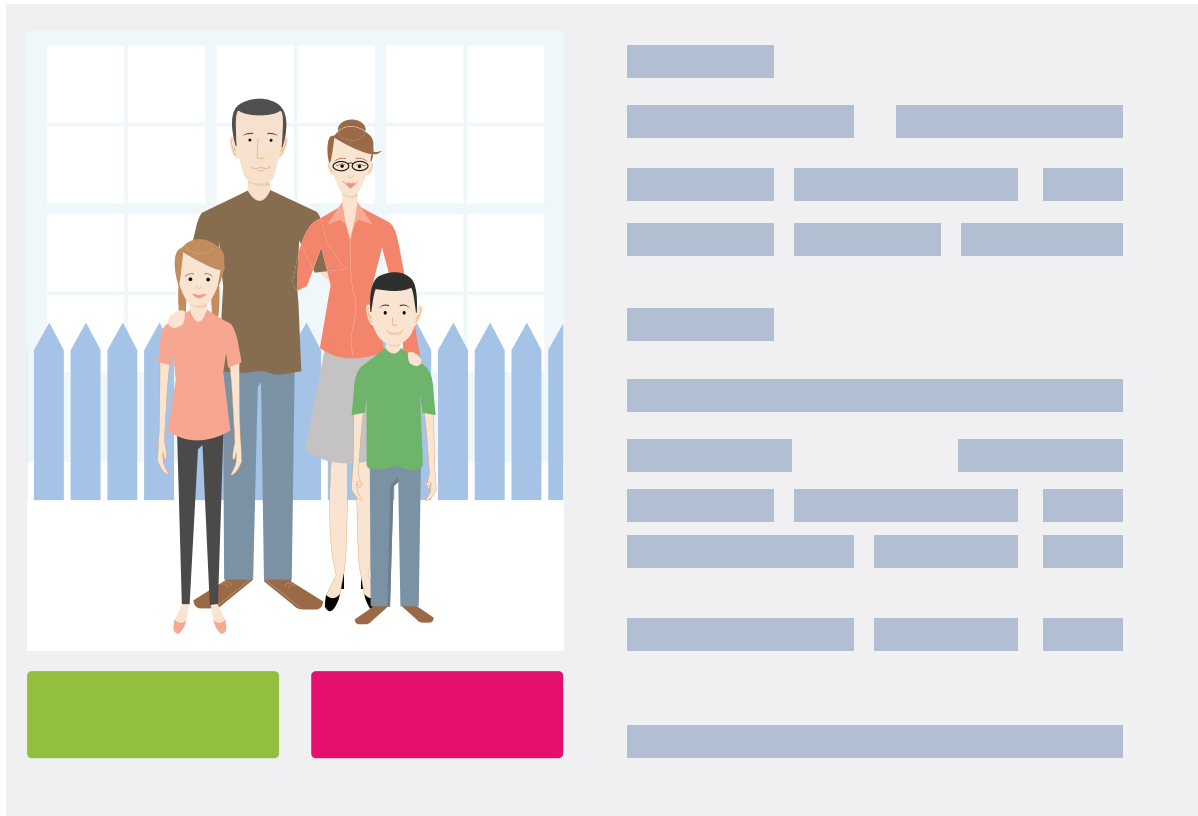
Become a Lingoo Homestay Teacher
